Dear Oregon Congressional Delegation,


I am writing to strongly urge you to support the Jordan Cove Energy Project. This project will provide a huge boost to Southwest Oregon and give our region the tools it needs to keep growing well into the future.

I am the manager of the Pony Village Mall, which is the largest indoor mall on the Oregon Coast, featuring over 60 retail stores, services and restaurants. We view the Mall as extension of the neighborhood and a partner in the community. Therefore, we see it as our responsibility to advocate for responsible development that creates jobs in the area, and in turn, brings success to the local businesses in Southwest Oregon. This is exactly what the Jordan Cove Energy Project will do.

The Jordan Cove Energy Project will improve Southwest Oregon's economy in a number of specific ways. First, the project will enhance the Port of Coos Bay and Southwest Oregon's infrastructure (with private dollars), helping our struggling community attract new businesses and create new jobs. The project will also generate tens of millions of dollars in tax revenue (or payments in lieu of taxes) for Coos, Douglas, Jackson and Klamath counties that will be used to improve local services and boost area schools, all of which will make our area more attractive for those thinking about moving to our community from other places. The fact that the Jordan Cove Energy Project will create hundreds of new – and permanent – family-wage jobs in Southwest Oregon will only increase the overall level of stimulus generated by this project.

Unfortunately, none of this will come to pass unless the Department of Energy approves Jordan Cove's application to export LNG to non-free trade agreement countries. I understand that DOE plans to only approve a handful of the proposed projects around the country. To me, this means we can't take any chances. I hope you will work overtime to ensure that Jordan Cove is one of the projects approved by DOE.
